Membership benefits

Members get discounts on regular priced merchandise at our sponsors - Campers Village, Fast Trax and Track N Trail. Twice a year, the EOOC participates in the MEC club night where members can save 10%.

Members get discounts at not only EOOC events, but at other clubs' events. Members have gotten discounts at orienteering events as far off as Vancouver and Arizona.

Season O-Pass

An (optional) O-Pass is a great *add-on to your membership* - only \$45 for a single pass or \$80 for a multi-pass, available for purchase until May 19th. There are two kinds of O-Pass:

1. A single O-Pass costs \$45* which entitles the holder to one free map at each Wednesday event this season. The pass is non-refundable and not transferable.

A household may buy a single O-Pass and either share the map or any one EOOC member in the household may use it. The pass is non-refundable and not transferable outside the EOOC members in the household. The other EOOC members in the household may buy additional maps at regular member prices if they wish.

2. 2. We also offer a **Multi O-Pass** for \$80*. This entitles every EOOC member in a household to a map each Wednesday. Again, non-refundable and not transferable outside the members in the household.

*Buy early and SAVE - if we receive your payment for an O Pass by March 31, you pay only \$40 for a single O-Pass or \$70 for a multi O-Pass.

Event schedule

Wednesday events (in city parks throughout Edmonton) run April through September (weather permitting.) Check the <u>Events page</u> on the website for detailed information.

Here are some of the other events running in the first part of this season:

- First Forest Event of the year is May 13 at J.J. Collett natural area, near Morningside (an hour's drive south of Edmonton.) This is a great area for beginners and intermediates. There are lots of trails (plus 2 outhouses and 2 gazebos), as well as a fence around the mile square area.
- National Orienteering Week May 20 28
- World Orienteering Day is May 24th. Watch for a special event that Wednesday at Kinsmen Park.

Check the website for more events and to confirm dates.

Other notable dates, for you travelling orienteers:

- July 15/16 Western Canadian Championships (Spruce Woods, MB)
- Jul 29 Aug 7 Canadian Orienteering Fest (including Canadian Orienteering Championships) near Ottawa.

Congrats to EOOC Member Will Critchley, who has been selected to compete for Canada at the World Games in Poland, July 20 – 30!

One of the great things about orienteering is that

..... there are no qualifying races/heats to enter the Alberta Championships, or the Westerns, or the Canadians. If you have the inclination, time and money you can sign up (pre-registration is usually required for Championships).

Or you can sign up for an 'age-less' open category, which will probably be on the same course as one of the competitive categories.

Our **Kids Run Wild** program will run again on TUESDAYS and THURSDAYS starting in April and May - active, fun navigation games for youth aged 7 to 16.
